Winterton Council support local groups

North Lincs "Streetsport". Twelve sessions were planned through the school holidays for young people in Winterton but this depended on funding. "Street sport" asked if the Town Council could help. Street sport sessions were held on the Astro Turf, The Council agreed that this provision was very important to the young people of the Town and agreed to support this by paying half the cost to provide this service. So far the Town Council have given grants to the Old School Hall Community Centre, the Winterton Playing Field Association, Winterton Show committee, the Gardens Festival Weekend, Panda Play for the children's summer scheme. The Council also have a sponsored board at the Winterton Rangers Football Club. The Winterton PFA (playing Fields Association) is currently working with the Town Council to improve facilities on the Newport Drive Playing Field. We want people to know that the Town Council is working for the community.

Road Safety — Earlsgate Winterton facts . . .

North Lincs Council stated that from a survey carried out between 24 April and 30 April 2010, the average number of vehicles surveyed per day was 5602. The average speed of those vehicles was 25.5 mph. (a more representative measure than a simple average—85th percentile speed—was 30.6 mph). The number of vehicles per day travelling over 35 mph was 222. Vehicles travelling between 35—40 mph was 181. 32 vehicles travelled between 40—45. 8 travelled at between 45—50 and one between 50—55 mph. North Lincolnshire Council are currently looking at the feasibility of upgrading the lighting on Earlsgate.

Funding for Marmion Drive Playing Field Provision

Winterton Town Council have secured money from the Local Strategic Partnership for floodlighting and for play provision for toddlers for the Marmion Drive Playing Field which the Town Council anticipate will increase use of the park for this area until 9.30 pm even on dark nights. It is hoped this will give some of the young people who like sport a bit more time in the park in an evening even in the winter. We would like to know whether parents feel the toddler area should be near the 8—14 year old provision or not? The funding that we thought we had secured for play for 9—14 year olds looks like it might be under threat from government cuts and the Town Council will have to wait and see whether it has been withdrawn. In the meantime work will start on the toddler area shortly—if you would like to be involved in helping to decide what equipment we have and live on the Grangefield Estate, please do let the council know.

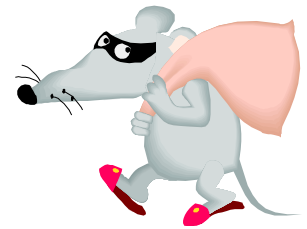
