The Town Council is disappointed with the decision of the Inspector in relation to the appeal lodged by Keigar Homes Ltd against North Lincolnshire Council. The Council appointed Cllr Paul McCartan as representative for the Town Council, who put forward a strong case against the development going ahead.

## **Road Closure**



We are pleased to assist the Winterton and District Lions on their Annual Steam Rally on the 16th and 17th of September. The Council have applied to North Lincolnshire Council to close off roads in the centre of the Town to allow the steam vehicles to stop in the Market place for people to view, as part of the Vintage Vehicle Run.



The closure will be managed by Council appointed marshals on the day.

The roads affected by the closure are Churchside, Market Place and the High Street. Access to the Co-op car park will be restricted until all vehicles are in situ. The closure will take place from 4.45pm to 6.30pm. The Humber Fast Cat service will not be affected by the closure.

## **Community Governance Review**

You may remember at the beginning of the year, North Lincolnshire Council asked for your views on the number of seats each Town Council holds. Winterton Town Council agreed to remain at 18 seats. As well as monthly meetings, the Council has 3 committees and a number of working groups. The Council also works with and supports a number of local groups.

A meeting of the Governance and Scrutiny Panel at NLC will take place on the 6th September to agree recommendations to go to Full Council for approval on the 21st of September.

The Town Council hopes that our numbers will remain the same.

All Town and Parish Councillors are voluntary and do not get paid.
