His son has had stones thrown at him as he has walked home from school. This has been dealt with by the School. There used to be a CCTV camera on Hiles Avenue and he said it acted as a deterrent.

Multi-Agency Meeting

Cllr V. Mumby and the Clerk attended a multi-agency meeting on Wednesday 26th September, at Rangers FC. Representatives from a number of different organisations attended, including Cllr Rob Waltham, Ward Councillors, Humberside Police, Winterton academy and Ongo.

Instead of minutes, a list of actions was produced. These were forwarded to Councillors, prior to the Council meeting and Councillors were asked to consider the actions for the Town Council.

These were:

- Encourage people to report every issue.
- Identifying registration plates of motorised vehicles, crash helmet colours etc.
- Anyone contacting the Town Council to report incidents is encouraged to report the incident to the police.

- WTC to further discuss Police recommendations for West Street Park. Looking at blind spots on the CCTV coverage.
- Lowering the wall, removing the mound, cutting back the trees and improving lighting in the park.
- Look at speed bumps on the High Street and West Street.

The Clerk has already met with the Council's conservation officer to discuss submitting a planning application to lower the wall at the West Street entrance and is now looking to obtain quotes from local architects to draw up plans to form part of the application. A lighting survey has been carried out in the park and a quote obtained to improve the lighting. Quotes have also been obtained to remove the teen shelter, skate ramp and bench at the High Street entrance. Councillors considered the suggestion to install speed bumps along West Street and the High Street to prevent the roads being used by motorised and non motorised vehicles as a "get away". Councillors agreed that installing speed bumps would not stop the roads being used by youths on bicycles and motorbikes, the number of complaints received from residents along Earls Gate relating to nuisance riders are evidence of that.

Resolution: The Council agreed that alternative solutions should be sought.

Flooding on South Street

Cllr D. Muldown wished to bring the issue of flooding on South Street to the attention of Councillors. Two or three times a year, heavy rainfall causes water to come up the street and cause the lower end of the road to flood, affecting a number of residents and properties. Cllr D. Muldown passed a number of photographs round to show Councillors, taken during these times.

Councillors considered a number of possible reasons as to why the area floods during heavy rainfall.

Resolution: The Council to write to Anglian Water and ask them to look into the problem and the possible solutions.

Cllrs P. McCartan and J. Kemp leave the room to investigate the further. Youths enter the building to use the toilet and Cllr Kemp waits until they have left before returning to the meeting.

Cllr R. Kimberley-Scott highlighted to Councillors that Cllr D. Johnson had attended a funeral recently as Deputy Mayor and was disappointed with the Deputy Mayor's chain. The Deputy Mayor was there to represent the Mayor of Winterton and the chain of office should reflect this.
