- 1904/4 Minutes of Previous Meeting

- 1904/6 Police Matters
The Clerk reported an increase in ASB in West Street. Large commercial bins, the tractor and tyres had been placed in the road to cause an obstruction. Youths had been reported on the roof of the OSH on a number of occasions, and were seen throwing eggs at passing vehicles by members of the Twinning group. Damage has been caused to the roof in three different areas. The flower beds outside of the office have been trampled on and plants removed. There has been an increase in litter. Stones have been thrown at the windows of the OSH, breaking the glass in two areas and damaging the frames in a number of areas. All incidents have been reported to the Police.

- 1904/7 May Elections
Cllr V. Mumby informed Councillors they would shortly receive a pack from the Electoral Team at NLC, detailing information on the forthcoming election, including details of the count, should anyone wish to attend. 1904/9 Community Transport

Standing orders were resumed

Resolution: The Council agreed to write to NLC and ask, in light of the recent announcement that Age UK will be closing their Scunthorpe Hub, what is their plans to cover the short fall in transport.
